7. **CRCSS Nomination**

Mahzeb: Can you explain what this is?

Albert: This is a committee under the Vice Provost's office. So if nothing is getting resolved amongst us, I could take the issue to this committee to resolve. Last year Dan was the UC representative, and the prior year was Sean Xu.

Dan: I want to nominate Ryan Hume.

Albert: I want to nominate Sophie Nielubowicz.

Dan: Ryan's sat on the UTSU for two years, been on the Lit for two years. Ryan's a guy; he does things, very involved, great guy. He's also very good with conflict resolution. I would trust him in this situation to be unbiased.

Albert: Sophie's really invested in the community, always in the CSC, knows what's going on around UC. She doesn't necessary have the decorative Lit experience but she's aware how it functions and has good conflict resolution skills!

8. Decision to Sign with Another Studio Company

Albert: I've had many discussions with Ramsey. We've been with Luxarte studios for a very long time. Last year they met with Ramsey to discuss continuing but there's a bunch of grievances he had. He had to chase them to get the contract. When Ramsey was deciding which to sign with last year, he gave Luxarte another trial year to resolve all the problems he listed. But at the end of this year there were still a bunch of issues that remain unresolved, such as Fireball photos not arriving on time and students kept coming to get them.

Some info is confidential so I'll try to summarize what I can.

Luxarte has 5 minutes for grad student photos, so if you took a composite you know how quick it was. So there are only digital prints now because they find that it's a waste to print pictures. Also their studio is in Hamilton so retakes have to happen there. This is one of their pushes, that they know how to handle UC because they've been with us for a while. Also they said if they don't come on time this year, the grad photos would be free they said.

So New Paramount Studios, their proposal was good but they only did print with no option for digital download. They seemed like a standard photo studio, and would offer a 10/10/10 plan (\$10 sitting fee, \$10 rebate back to the Lit), which they said, was amendable depending on what

we wanted. They have an external studio nearby on St Clair Avenue West, which is a pro, but the lack of digital compared to the other two companies was definitely felt.

Lassman studios, I met with them last, it's a mix of both the two companies' qualities. They shoot the entire year; they shoot for all the other colleges at U of T, and dentistry, medicine and pharmacy. They do prints and advertise the option. They would take our Lit photos as well. They'd do all our events for free as well. Also they make bobble-heads of all of us. They know how to run a business. They were trying to get with us for a while. And that's why I decided to go with Lassman. I'm really excited to work with Lassman for the upcoming year.

Aidan: Does the Lit bobble-heads come with additional costs to UC students?

Albert: No they are complimentary. Also to add, they give students 15 minutes, and throughout the year. They give people a chance to do group/funny shots as well.

Sameer: If the bobble-heads are free anyways, can you ask if other students can also get bobble-heads at a cost if they want, so it's not exclusive to council?

Albert: Students can order it themselves but it's at a market price of \$120.

Sameer: Can they reduce it to the cost price?

Albert: I can ask.

9. **SCC Social Media Policy**

Dan: Basically I'm proposing slight change to social media policy. I'd like to give posting rights to core exec and SCC (myself, deputies, reps ratified to my commission) and give all other execs moderator rights, which is when they can respond to messages only. There's over posting and clustering, where none of the events posted at the same time get much reach. Also this will avoid misuse of Lit page where people made comments in prior years. If we have to keep every commissioner trained, it could be harder to maintain, whereas a smaller group is easier to maintain.

Danielle: Where can we find the policy?

Dan: This is policy in a vague and abstract sense. We'll have a meeting in the summer to discuss social media practices.

Sameer: How are you proposing the procedure of posting?

Dan: For example, if Kaitlyn wants to post something, message the page like 24 hours before the post is needed and edits can be made accordingly.

Albert: How it's going so far is good; I think it's a really good idea.

Michelle: Do reps on your commission need to be on this? I don't think it's necessary.

Dan: We're trying to flesh out the rep role this year, so this could give reps a concrete impact in my commission.

Paul: Would there be some place where we could message the entire group in charge of posting?

Dan: The process would be messaging the UC Lit's Facebook page, where everyone with admin status can see it. If AJ is the first one to see it, then he could be the one to post it and everyone will see that he's posted.

Mahzeb: If the event's going on and you want to take a picture and post it what happens?

Dan: We'll make sure that someone is ready to post or temporary access could be provided.

Aster: What if it starts raining and a quad event needs to be moved?

Dan: You could post in the event page yourself with your personal account since people would still see the post.

Albert: Barring that immediate need for posting, it's giving SCC more agency in that role. This puts emphasis on planning for your events, communication and marketing to all go smoothly.

Aidan: Another UTSU report: The Social Justice Equity Commission might have a pride-planning meeting. Also I spoke to Chim and he said they're putting a pride and policing discussion event, and they'll be bringing in Rodney Diverlus who is the co-founder of the Black Lives Matter Toronto.

Anushka: I've moved into a condo near St. Mikes so I'm thinking Lit social. I'll put some dates, probably Saturday toward the end of June.

Dan: Today I will update the UC Lit schedule on the website.

Anushka: Do you want UTSU stuff on there too?

Dan: If it's UC Lit related then yes.

Albert: On the 9th there's a pride event. Pride is always a fun time.
