Daman: Robert's Rules of Order is a list of rules in order to facilitate the meeting. These are the most important terms of Robert's Rules of Order:

- a. Substantive Motion - a motion that is trying to accomplish something. In this case, it is to have the motion approved.
- b. Three Important Points to Know:
  - i. Point of Order: You can interrupt the speaker's list but not when they are speaking" - this is if you feel that we deviated from the rules or are breaking them
  - ii. Point of Information: To ask a question to get more information - do not use them to skip the speaker's list or put new information by asking rhetorical
  - iii. Point of Personal Privilege: If you feel as though there is something that is barring you from working productively, it may be accessibility, and you can bring it up

Paul: Please remember that only those who are elected get to vote. (ie. Kiana, Daman, Heather, Dan, and Meng are NOT able to vote)

Daman: In regards to voting, there are three options - Vote in favour, vote against, or abstain (most motions need 50%+, otherwise it will fail and the clauses will fail)

Priya: I was on the college council this year and there was a lot to learn. I feel like I can bring forth these experiences and choose profs that can best serve UC.

Maureen: I think as a first year who has just joined the university I can offer a lot of insight in this position. I would want to be more involved and I would choose professors that help represent UC's values.

Paul: The hiring committee does all of the hiring for all of the UC Lit's staff such as the mental health commissioner, Diabolos co-manager, secretary, and speaker. A lot of important decisions will be made and will change college life.

Paul nominates all of the mid-year and upper-year reps (all of the reps accept except Sabrina, Albert, Nicole, and Willa). Alisa nominates herself, Felipe nominates himself, and Kaitlyn nominates herself.

Priya: I think I have past experience on council and an interesting way to choose the hiring committee is to hire people from different positions. I would really appreciate to have a say on key aspects in UC and I think I can give a lot into this role.

- Willa motivates: "She's been involved on a lot of different hiring committees and she's done a very good job with that because she is very impartial. Reps are also very involved in the community and has good experience."

Thomas: I have experience hiring as a frosh exec and a commissioner and I can bring a lot to this position because I can offer an unique perspective.

- Kirsten motivates: "Thomas has had a lot of experience hiring for Frosh and he is very unbiased. He is a wonderful person with a unique view and he is very good as connecting with people and making them feel comfortable. He offers a lot of new perspectives and experiences."

Hiba: I think I have a lot of good experiences I can bring forward although haven't been on the Lit. I can really offer a new set eyes and bring new ideas to the table.

- Albert motives: "I think it's really important to have representation on the hiring committee and that people who make the decisions are getting all areas of students. Based on Hiba's platform, she would be very good for this position."
- Kiana motivates: "I agree with Albert because Hiba can bring in new insight and be very devoted to her commitments."
- Nicole motivates: "I also motivate for Hiba because her entire platform was for student advocacy and she can extend that mindset when making the decision to hire people. She prioritizes equity, which was her platform."

Maureen: Although I haven't been on the Lit before, I have been involved in different aspects in UC and in high school as well - I will bring a new set of views and unique skills to this job.

Aster: I have experience on the council and have been able to understand the council from an outside perspective - I know the things that the Lit does great but also things that are currently missing so I can hire people who can fill these gaps.

- Danielle motivates: "Aster has the necessary skills to be very unbiased when it comes to hiring. She has done hiring for Hart House and being a rep on the hiring committee makes you more involved."

Kaitlyn: I think I would be a great candidate because I have had to hire a lot of people in the past and I have been a part of Diabolos myself. As well, I have been a part of lots of groups that have needed to hire. Plus, I will be available all summer since I'm here anyways!

Felipe: I have a lot experience hiring since I helped hire in the summer. I also have the experience of hiring since I am an executive for Frosh. I believe that I know what to look for in an interview - I understand what to ask and what to keep in mind when people are answering questions.

- Paul motivates: "I have had experience working with him when hiring and he provides insight that I am not able to. Felipe is very conscious to other perspectives and options and he can be very bold and point out the flaws in the candidate's arguments."

Alisa: I have been in the UC community for a few years now and as the equity and outreach commissioner, I think my position would be very valuable since I can provide a perspective on who would be best suited for positions. I also have experience hiring leaders as an exec and want to see people who uphold UC values.

Albert reminds the nominees that a lot of the scheduling for this position happens during the year and individuals should consider reviewing their time commitments. He says, "if you know you do not have a lot of time, consider foregoing this because it is very difficult to set up."

Priya and Hiba are voted in and appointed to the hiring committee.

Albert: This position is so further changes and discussions can happen. These include decisions about new equipment or an honorarium to be added to Diabolos Coffee.

Danielle: The coffee board meets once a month.

Miranda nominates Kaitlyn (accepts nomination), Noah nominates Aster (declines nomination), and Albert nominates himself.

Kaitlyn: As a barista for the past two years, I that I know how things work at Diabolos' Coffee and I can bring a lot of knowledge to this role! I also want to speak on behalf of Dan Proctor who was on it last year and he found it very difficult for a non-coffee person to do it - as a coffee person I want to contribute in this position.

- Kiana motivates: "She is a coffee person and has great managerial skills."

Albert: I got a lot of experience on the coffee board this year and I also have had experiences so that I can understand what is feasible. Going forward on the rep capacity I want to further contribute to this board and make sure that it is helping UC students.

- Alex motivates: "I think Albert would be a great candidate because he's a rep again for a reason and has a good say of what Diabolos can do"
- Priya motivates: "He would be really great for this position because he can do a lot for Diabolos since he doesn't have too much on his plate this year."
- Nicole motivates: "Albert is so involved, has a diverse perspective, and he can cater to UC students."

After the voting, Kaitlyn is the elect of the coffee board on a 10-9 vote.

### **Mental Health:**

Hiya! My name is Kiana and I am UC's mental health commissioner for 2018. I am entering my third year, double majoring in Neuroscience and cognitive science.

As mental health commissioner, I would like to enhance accessibility to resources and the inclusion of students. This will involve creating a platform where students are able to access the mental health resources they need as quickly as possible. This may entail distributing information on available resources to on campus and off campus students. If possible, it will be very useful to have this information to be available online and in person to increase our outreach. This could be as pamphlets distributed on residence, the Lit office and the Lit website.

As commissioner, I will also strive to use my position to pressure authorities in the administration to improve the current state of mental health resources offered. Though studying at U of T is a privilege, our health is not. Our health is our right, and we must protect it. Students need to feel in control of it.

As commissioner, it is therefore important that I remain approachable to students and welcoming to ideas for improvement from my fellow commissioners, peers and mental health professionals.

Last but not least, as commissioner I hope to create a commission that promotes personal autonomy and values a sense of stability. We can aspire to achieve this goal by running de-stressors, being responsive to students and providing them with the help they deserve.

### **Off-Campus:**

This is a short report as I am still not fully aware of what the exact expectations are for me as a commissioner or of the exact scope of my commission. With that said, there are three goals I have in mind for the commission for the next month.

#### 1. Hire a deputy

I will carry out the entire hiring process for the deputy. I would like to choose a deputy that sees eye to eye with my vision and my goals for the commission. This means somebody who would like to re-establish the presence of the commission in the community and has the drive to make it happen.

#### 2. Plan out a list of events

### **Sustainability:**

These are some of the things I wanted to work on, and see in the commission for next year.

BYOC event - This event went super well this year, and was a great way to get people to bring reusable containers

Sustainable checklist/auditing for other UCLit Commissions - I wanted to make a sustainability checklist for commissions for their events. For example, a commission can check off if they didn't use any water bottles, or styrofoam plates/cups. It'd be a good way to increase sustainability in the commissions. Albert suggested having a "thermometer" to gauge how hot the UCLit was doing each month in terms of waste reduction. I also think it'd be a good idea to advertise on the UCLit fb page how the commissions as a whole are doing in terms of sustainability!

Waste reduction campaigns - I wanted to implement some waste reduction campaigns, especially in Fung and Rezzie's. Mostly just encouraging people to bring reusable containers, and to work on waste diversion (ie recycling and composting). Incorporating something like a contest or prizes would be a good incentive for students.

Collaboration events - I'd like to do some collaboration events with the UAA, Mental Health, and Equity Commissions. With the UAA, I'd like to do a Coffee with the Profs with faculty in environmental



based disciplines, urban planning, etc. With the Mental Health Commission, I'd like to continue with our planting de-stressors. With the Equity Commission, I'd love to do an educational event about something like accessibility in sustainability/environmental work, or about inequity in some sustainable work (like about how donating clothes, while potentially for immediate sustainability, can be inequitable when sent/sold to other countries).
